The Book of Job - Navigating Pain & Suffering

MEANING: Job has two possible meanings:

• Hebrew: "The persecuted one." • Arabic: "Repentant one."

AUTHOR: Unknown

TIME WRITTEN: The historical events appear to be set sometime between Noah and Moses. There are no allusions to the Law of Moses in the book, but there is a mention of a flood (**Job 22:16**). Job functions as a priest in offering sacrifices for his family (**Job 1:5**), similar to what we find with Abraham (cf. **Gen 12:7**). His longevity is typical of the patriarchs (**Job 42:16**; cf. **Gen 11:22-26, 32**). For such reasons a reasonable understanding would place him somewhat contemporary with Abraham (i.e., ca 2000 B.C.) about 935 B.C.
